



#### TREND 1: INVISIBLE TO VISIBLE

Governments may also struggle to see the different paths they can take to design successful policies and services. Governments are taking innovative steps to make these invisible factors visible.



#### Zika Mozzie Seeker






Availability of a strategic document on open government




## ..and fewer systematically evaluate Open Government reforms

OECD Recommendation on Open Government (2018)

1. Enabling environment

Strategic, legal and regulatory frameworks; human, financial, and technical resources; open government literacy



2. Implementing frameworks

Co-ordination mechanisms; monitoring and evaluation; communication; ATI; stakeholder participation processes



Based on the idea that cultural consumption is important both for enriching yourself as a person and strengthening the fabric of our society, in 2016 the Italian government introduced a 500€ cultural bonus for all 18-year-old people living in Italy. Young people can spend it on cultural items and activities such as going to theatres, concerts and museums, buying books, etc. They have to register online and then spend the money through the dedicated website 18app.it, accessible from any device. This was promoted through an extensive online campaign on social media by the government.






